Chief Judge Mary Ann Cohen of the United States Tax Court announced that the written examination for applicants other than attorneys at law for admission to practice will be held at 12:15 p.m. on Thursday, November 9, 2000, at the United States Tax Court Building, 400 Second Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20217. This announcement is the notice required by Tax Court Rule 200(d).

The Chief Judge further announced that the examination will consist of the following subjects and that those subjects shall be accorded the percentage weight indicated in parenthesis:

- a. Tax Court Rules of Practice and Procedure, including Interim New Rules & Amendments to the Rules (25%);
- b. Federal Rules of Evidence (25%);
- c. Federal taxation (40%);
- d. Legal ethics, including the ABA Model Rules of Professional Conduct (10%).

Applicants may obtain from the Tax Court copies of the most recent examinations for a fee of 50¢ per page payable to the Clerk of the Court. The Tax Court Rules of Practice and Procedure, including Interim Rules and Amendments to the Rules, are available for \$14.00 per copy by writing to the Tax Court's Administrative Office (Room 150), at 400 Second Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20217. A check or money order payable to "Clerk, U.S. Tax Court" should accompany the written request. The Tax Court Rules are also available at the Tax Court's official web site www.ustaxcourt.gov.

The Court will begin accepting applications on June 2, 2000, and all applications must be received properly completed no later than October 2, 2000.
